

What you need to know:

This week's session looks at the amazing life cycle of the Atlantic salmon which spend part of their lives in our rivers and part in the Atlantic ocean. It introduces the fact that there are different names for the different parts of the life cycle. They are anadromous fish meaning they can live in both fresh and salty water.

Key words: egg, alevin, fry, parr, smolt, adult, redd, anadromous

All you need to do:

- Watch the video clip
- Discuss with the children the similarity with humans having different names at different stages of our lives, babies, toddlers, children, teenagers and adults.
- Read through the activity sheet with children.
