#### **Terms and Conditions:**


Canoeing can take place <u>only</u> when the water height is above the red line on the <u>gauge at Llangurig</u> <u>and</u> <u>at no other times.</u>


Please note that the water height condition applies all year round, not just to the 16th March to 17th October period as with the

This stretch is rarely in the right condition for good paddling and water levels can drop away very quickly. Most canoeists choose to start at the Dernol access point where the flow is greater.

Newbridge to Glasbury reaches.

The general terms and conditions for upper Wye paddling always apply.





## **Llangurig Access Point**


### **Directions:**

From Builth take the A470 north, passing through Rhayader and on to Llangurig. At the roundabout just, take the left turn (A44 to Aberystwyth) into Llangurig. Once in the village take the turning left opposite the Black Lion Hotel. Follow this lane on to the bridge, unloading quickly on the Llangurig side <u>without blocking the road.</u>

If parking is required use the public car park back up the lane on your right. Please note that there is a height restriction bar set at 6ft 9 inches.

Accessing the water: WARNING!!!!!!

Access the river via the small gate on the downstream side of Llangurig Bridge (Llangurig or left bank). Enter the water as close to the bridge as possible as the gravels just downstream are an important fish spawning area at various times during the year, especially for salmon during the winter and grayling in April. Avoid disturbing the gravels with paddles or feet.




## **Dernol Access/Exit Point**

#### **Directions:**

From Llangurig take the A470 south for approximately 4 miles. Take the turning right, signposted to Dernol. Follow this lane for another ½ mile until you come to the bridge. Park in the lay-by on the right on the other (north) side of the bridge.

## Accessing & exiting the water:

From the lay-by enter the field on the right bank of the downstream side of the bridge, via the metal gate. Proceed directly to the river from there.



## **Marteg Access/Exit Point**

### **Directions:**

From Llangurig take the A470 south for approximately 6.4 miles. Just before the road crosses the Marteg stream, you will see a large lay-by on your right, marking the parking and exit point for this reach.

## **Exiting the water:**

Exit the river on the left bank just upstream of the small suspension bridge. It is also the start of the Marteg to Llanwrthwl section.

PLEASE BE AWARE THAT THIS IS A WILDLIFE RESERVE SO KEEP NOISE AND DISTURBANCE TO A MINIMUM. DO NOT CROSS THE BRIDGE WITH CANOES.
